Airport Transfers:

Newcastle International Airport (NCL) regularly receives flights from Amsterdam (KLM), Paris (Air France), and London Heathrow (British Airways), as well as from many other cities and airlines.

The airport is a 15min car ride to the city centre.

Metro System:

There is a metro station at Newcastle Airport connecting you to the city centre. The journey to Newcastle city centre (Haymarket, Monument or Central Station) takes around 25 minutes. There are trains every 12 minutes from approximately 5.39am (Sundays 6.26am) to 11.09pm.

Trains from main airports to Newcastle:

Manchester Airport:

- Approximately two trains per hour.
- The TransPennine Express to Saltburn, changing at York for the London North Eastern Railway service to • Aberdeen. One change; journey duration 3 hours 6 minutes.
- The TransPennine Express to Edinburgh (Waverley), changing at Manchester Piccadilly for the TransPennine Express to Newcastle. One change; journey duration 3 hours 13 minutes.
- The TransPennine Express to Carlisle, changing at Manchester Piccadilly for the TransPennine Express to Scarborough, changing at York for the TransPennine Express to Newcastle. Two changes; journey duration 3 hours 10 minutes.

Edinburgh Airport:

- Approximately three trains per hour from Edinburgh Gateway Station (which is an 8-minute tram ride from • Edinburgh Airport).
- The ScotRail service to Edinburgh Waverley, changing at Edinburgh Waverley for the London North Eastern Railway service to London Kings Cross. One change; journey duration 1 hour 56 minutes.

Gatwick Airport:

- Approximately two trains per hour. •
- The Thameslink service to Cambridge, changing at London St Pancras International and walking to London Kings Cross for the London North Eastern Railway service to Edinburgh Waverley. One change, journey duration 4 hours 25 minutes.

Heathrow:

- Approximately two trains per hour.
- The Heathrow Express service from Heathrow Terminal 5 to London Paddington, changing at London Paddington to take the tube to London Kings Cross, followed by the London North Eastern Railway service from London Kings Cross to Edinburgh Waverley. Two changes; journey duration 4 hours 29 minutes.

Eurostar Transfers:

If you travel via the Eurostar to London St Pancras, there are direct trains to Newcastle from London Kings Cross (A short walk from St Pancras station). This train will typically be a London North-Eastern Railway service to Edinburgh (Waverley) or to Aberdeen, both stop at Newcastle. Please note trains from London to Newcastle can take up to 3 and a half hours.

Driving to Newcastle and Parking:

Please check hotel information for parking alternatively there are 9 multi storey car parks, 52 off street car parks and around 2,200 street parking bays.






Social Events
